

Didsbury High School Construction Site Newsletter

No.3 – September 2018

Welcome to our newsletter, which aims to keep you up to date with what is happening on our site.

What we are building

A new secondary school, sports hall and associated external facilities to provide much needed additional school places for local residents.

The school, which includes a 6th Form, will open in September 2019. This is a free school, funded directly by the Department for Education, and operated by an approved provider, the Laurus Trust.

Recent progress

The design of the new school continues to develop in line with programme, with recent design works concentrating on steel frame, concrete floor slabs, building façade, windows/curtain walling and the roof.

On site we have seen completion of the piled foundations and the surface water attenuation system, whilst earthworks and drainage continue.

Concrete pile caps and ground beams are now complete, whilst the steel frame continues to be erected in readiness for installation of the concrete floor slabs over the forthcoming period (see photograph opposite).

What's next?

The next quarter will see us completing erection of the steel frame structure and casting the concrete upper floor slabs. The ground floor slab will be installed alongside the upper floors, with SFS (steel frame system) elevation infill panels, roof and window/curtain walling installation to follow.

Drainage and external works will continue, with scaffold erection enabling commencement of the brickwork façade.

Deliveries to site, and wagons removing spoil from site, continue to utilise The Avenue for access/egress. Parking for all construction related vehicles is accommodated on site, helping to minimise disruption in the surrounding area, and full time security cover, including CCTV monitoring, is in place.
