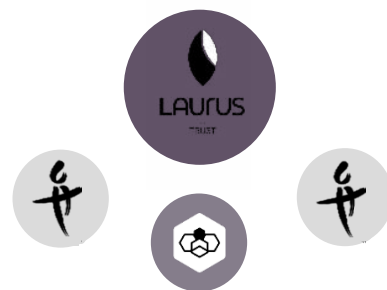

Dear Students,

Around the world, during the month of June, LGBTQ communities celebrate Pride. Whilst Pride can mean something different to each of us depending on our own unique circumstances, we can all celebrate the myriad of ways we are alike and find joy in the ways that each of us is unique.

This newsletter therefore is themed around identity and self-expression.

WHAT IS IDENTITY?

Your sense of **identity** has to do with who you think you are and how you **perceive** yourself. It's about how you define yourself. **Self-esteem** is how you **value** yourself. It has to do with your sense of self-worth and is often based on comparisons with others. **Self-expression** then is how you **show** the world your identity.
